Up to 18 papers will be selected from open submissions on the basis of peer review. Contributions are invited on (but not limited to) one or more of the following topics:

- The evaluation of science policy**
- Organising research activities in universities, PROs and private R&D labs**
- Spillovers from scientific research**
- Role of gender and family in scientific research**
- Science research networks and collaboration**
- Scientific careers and mobility**

Deadline for the submission of papers or extended abstracts (min 3 pages) is **January 31st 2019**. Submissions should be previously unpublished works. All submissions are reviewed with respect to novelty, academic quality and relevance. No review or comments will be offered to the authors to supplement the decision.
